#### FLORENCE CITY COUNCIL

On August 22, 2023 Mayor Julie Aubuchon and the Florence City Council recognized the Friends of the Shelter for thirty-three years of unwavering service to animal welfare in the Northern Kentucky community. This date proclaimed "Friends of the Shelter Day" promotes our mission to significantly reduce the number of stray and abandoned animals in our community through affordable spay/neuter services.

### **FOTS MEETINGS**

At our August meeting a motion was made to change the time for our monthly meetings to avoid driving in the dark in winter. A vote was taken and the meetings will now be at 3:00 pm.

#### SHELTER UPDATES

As we mentioned in our 2022 newsletter, **Boone County** is building a new shelter in Burlington on Idlewild, not far from the existing shelter. Construction started early this year. Friends of the Shelter donated \$50,000 to the building fund and their Catio will be named for us.





This year we voted to award \$50,000 to **Pendleton County** for the construction of their new shelter. They have recently begun excavation and mapping out the trails. It should be framed in another 2 months. The city donated the land. They will name their spay/neuter clinic for us.



**Bracken County** is the seventh county that we support with our spay/neuter program. They were voted in at our November 2022 meeting.


#### **ADOPT A SENIOR PET**

November is senior pet month. Everybody loves kittens and puppies. Senior pets are widely overlooked. The senior phase of a cat's life be-

gins at 11 years old and a dog's at 7-9 years.
